### SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Organising Authority (OA) is Royal Perth Yacht Club (RPYC)

#### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

#### 2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located downstairs at Royal Perth Yacht Club.

#### 3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 1500 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

#### 4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag staff on the ceremonial deck on the north side of the Club house.
- 4.2 When Flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with not less than 30 minutes in the race signal AP.

#### 5. SCHEDULE

- 5.1 The regatta will consist of a practice session followed by a series of races.

## **6. CLASS FLAG**

6.1 The class flag will be a BW8 insignia on a white background.

## **7. SAIL COMBINATION**

7.1 The sail combination to be used will be signalled from the RC boat at least 5 minutes before the warning signal. No sound signal is required. The signals shall have the following meaning.

### **SIGNAL**

None

Flag R

Flag Z

### **SAIL COMBINATION**

Genoa + Full mainsail + Spinnaker

Jib + Mainsail + Spinnaker

Jib + Mainsail

## **8. RACE AREA**

8.1 Racing will be conducted in Matilda Bay.

## **9. COURSES**

9.1 The diagram in attachment A shows the courses, including the approximate angles between the marks, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

## **10. MARKS**

10.1 Marks 1 & 2 will be orange pimple marks.

10.2 The Starting and finishing mark will be a black and white chequered buoy.

## **11. THE START**

11.1 A warning signal made 1 minute before the starting sequence.

11.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starting mark at the starboard end and the course side of the port end starting mark.

## **12. THE FINISH**

12.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag at the port end and the course side of the starboard-end finishing mark.

## **13. TARGET TIME**

13.1 The target time for each race will be 15 minutes.

## **14. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS**

14.1 Protest forms are available from the Boating Operations office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.

## **15. SCORING**

15.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

15.2 When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

15.3 When 4 to 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her scores excluding her worst score.

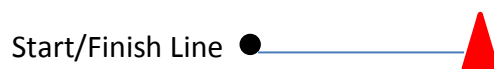
**16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**
