

Sailor Development Program

Summer Sailing Season 2022/23

The Sailor Development Program (SDP) is a series of programs designed to assist people who have completed the Learn to Sail (Keelboat Crew & Helm) course, or have equivalent sailing experience, to further develop their sailing skills to be "race-ready" as crew, also, if desired, go on to skipper a sailing boat. The SDP is a member service program at Royal Perth Yacht Club (RPYC). The programs cover:

Program units and content	Duration	
Spinnaker handling symmetric and asymmetric: launch, gybe and recover spinnakers, trimming sheet and brace, as well as helming under spinnaker.	5 weekly on-water sessions of 4 hours each. Total 20 hours.	
Racing: sail and boat trim, racing rules and "colregs", teamwork and personal preparation. Starts & racing practice.	2 evening seminars, 3 hours each. 5 weekly on-water sessions, 3 in boat handling techniques and 2 in racing practice, 4 hours each. Total 26 hours.	
Skipper: Departing and arrival at a pen and a jetty, anchoring and mooring, helming skills, MOB recovery, towing, under power, risk management, "colregs" and Racing Rules, chart work, intro to GPS, basic maintenance.	2 evening seminars, 3 hours each. 3 weekly on-water sessions, plus a river night navigation exercise. 4 hours each. Total 22 hours.	
Segment: Navigation and night navigation Seminar on local chart work and GPS. Bring your own Swan River Chart, if you have one.	1 evening seminar, 3 hours; plus: 1 evening sail on the river, 4 hours. 1 evening on <i>ORPYC</i> , working with the GPS Chart Plotter	
Night navigation exercise on the river - Your boat or ours!		

NB: The seminars in each program are an integral and required component. The racing and skipper programs are available to sailors who do not wish to sail with spinnakers, such as JAM (jib & main only) and mid-week fleets.

You may elect to undertake any single program or complete all three programs.

The programs operate on a rotation basis (as we complete one program, we will commence the next). The schedule at RPYC for the next few months is shown in the table below:

All programs will operate with a minimum of 3, and maximum of 5, trainees on each boat.

At the completion of these programs, your coaches will introduce you to the next stages at RPYC for longer-term development of your sailing skills. Racing skills development continues at RPYC year-round in fleet, match and teams racing.
